Bug Spray and Sunscreen

Please be advised that staff members will **not** apply sunscreen or insect repellant on students.

 For safety, these should not be shared between students, nor sprayed indoors.

Please be advised of the following Alberta Health Services recommendations:

- Please do not apply bug spray prior to children leaving for school as prolonged exposure to bug spray is not recommended for elementary-age children.
- Please send long pants and longsleeved jackets with your child as it is much better for students to cover up when they are outside, rather than using bug spray.
- The peak eating times for mosquitoes are dawn and dusk and these times are not during school hours, so by covering up, children should be okay outside.

We are collecting finished, cardboard toilet paper rolls for a school wide project on National Indigenous Peoples' Day. Please send your rolls to school with your child!

Supporting Wellness in our Schools and Families

Late Students

The Impact of Being Late: Every Minute Counts

We understand that mornings can be busy, but arriving late—especially regularly—can have a significant impact on student learning. With **184 instructional days** in the school year, even small daily delays add up quickly:

- Being 10 minutes late
 each day = 31 hours lost
 per year
- Being 30 minutes late
 each day = 92 hours lost
 per year
- Being 1 hour late each day = 184 hours lost, the equivalent of more than a full month of school

Arriving on time helps students start the day with focus, catch important instructions, and feel more connected to classroom routines. We appreciate your support in helping students arrive promptly so they can make the most of every learning opportunity.
